Learning Objectives:

- To develop a range of thinking skills.
- To use an atlas to locate places and analyse photographs.
- To determine Bangladesh's global context.
- To identify the effects of floods in Bangladesh.
- To assess the relationship between development and flood response.

Suggested activities:

Introduction: Using an atlas/the Web, locate Bangladesh and discover general physical and economic characteristics of the country (see http://www.aber.ac.uk/iges/cti-g/hazards99/quakeweb/theeffec.htm). Compare and contrast this with similar data for the UK.

Main: From news reports of flooding in Bangladesh compare and contrast the impact of these floods with flooding in the UK. Are the effects of flooding in Bangladesh worse than in the UK? Why is this the case? Write a piece of continuous text to report on these differences.
