



## Description:

Writing a newspaper article using a personal account.

# Learning Objectives:

Pupils will appraise a text quickly and effectively; to retrieve information from it; to find information quickly and to evaluate its value

Pupils will learn how to secure the skills of skimming and scanning and efficient reading so that research is fast and effective.

## Suggested activities:

#### Shared text work:

Introduce the class to Mandy Striegl's report on the activity sheet and ask the pupils to read it through. Hand out any further newspaper reports found on accounts of flooding.

## Focused word work/focused sentence work:

Independent reading, writing or word work: Mandy Streigl article

Using the Junior Reporter templates, analyse the flood account listing the important points. Rewrite the report for a younger audience using the second template.

#### **Plenary:**

Report back to class with rewritten reports and or further newspaper articles found. Discuss content and appropriateness.

#### **Resources:**

Mandy Striegl's flood account. Newspaper template sheets.

## Learning outcomes:

Pupils are able to list main facts of an article and then re-write reports for a younger audience.

#### Extension activities:

Using accounts from other flooding or disaster incidents found on the Internet or in newspapers, pupils should adapt the text for a younger audience.
